District 4 Minutes

MINUTES OF DISTRICT 4 MEETING - DECEMBER 11, 2021

District 4's meeting for 4th Quarter of 2021 was held on Saturday, December 11, 2021, at the Rosenberg Library in Galveston. Margaret F., District Representative, opened the meeting at 9:30 AM and members recited the Serenity Prayer. Members read the Al-Anon Traditions and Concepts/Warranties.

Present at this meeting were Margaret F.-DR from Alvin AFG, Kimmy-GR of Courage to Change AFG, Teresa-GR of Pearland AFG, Stacey-Alt GR of Hope For Today AFG, Paulette-Alt DR from Hope For Today AFG, Barbara-Progress in Session AFG, Delia-GR of Alvin AFG, Renee-Alateen Coordinator and GR of Surfside AFG, Kim-Treasurer of Let It Begin With Me AFG, Sheri-Public Outreach Coordinator from Let It Begin with Me AFG, Bev-visitor from Al-Anon Works Alvin AFG, Linda F-GR of Let It Begin With Me AFG, Joyce-Archivist from Pearland AFG, and Mattie T.-Delegate of Panel 61 from Courage to Change AFG. Also present on Zoom were Nora-Spanish Speaking Coordinator and Jonee-from Eldridge AFG. A total of 8 Group Representatives from District 4 were present at this meeting.

Minutes from the September 11th meeting were read and are also in the current <u>The Light</u> newsletter. Correct spelling of Sheri D's name was noted. Linda F. made a motion to accept the minutes as amended, and Teresa seconded the motion.

Treasurer's Report was presented by Kim, Treasurer. Margaret suggested that the Literature Purchases shown in the Other Expenses section be moved to Public Outreach Coordinator's line to include that expense in P.O. budget. Kim reported that since report was printed, \$100 in donations and two expenses need to be added. She will pay \$143 to reimburse Margaret for Fall Assembly expenses and \$25 to herself for storage and organization supplies. She also noted that she has saved Treasury's current spreadsheets on a USB stick. Linda F. made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report as corrected, and Delia seconded the motion.

Delegate Report - Mattie T., Texas East's Panel 601 Delegate, presented a workshop entitled "Facing Our Biases." She passed out a paper of 15 questions on "Taking A Personal Inventory" and 6 principles on "Using Al-Anon's Spiritual Principles." The workshop was informative, and Members shared on how these topics related to their Al-Anon recovery.

District 4 Representative report – Margaret F. reported that members who attended the September meeting voted to hold all District 4 meetings in Alvin at the Alvin Taylor Street Club at 204 S. Taylor Street as it is a central location. Margaret stated that future District 4 meetings will start with fellowship at 9AM and Business meeting will start at 9:30 AM. She announced that The Day in Al-Anon fundraiser on Saturday, March 26, 2022, will also be held at the Alvin Taylor Street Club. She reported gratitude for District 4's good attendance at the ETAAC Fall Assembly in San Marcos. A total of 89 GR's were present, that included 11 GRs from our district (and that represents one-third of all GRs in District 4.

Margaret reported that Texas East Area 53 has a new Area Secretary, and it is Mandy T. from District 1. The address for donations to Area 53 is shown in <u>The Light</u> newsletter, and Margaret said it was "ETAAA, P.O. Box 450675, Laredo, TX 78045." She also noted that Members can subscribe to Area's <u>The Beacon</u> newsletter for \$6 annually; electronic subscriptions are recommended. Margaret reported that reimbursement of mileage for travel to Al-Anon events was increased from 33 cents per mile to 40 cents per mile. A workforce committee was working on the Electronic Meeting project created by Area 53 service structure. Both the WSO and Texas East have approved the policy of Alateen Safety and Behavior Requirements. She expressed gratitude for an excellent job by our Groups on communications and also responding to emails that are beneficial.

Paulette, Alt. D.R. reported that WSO stated problems occurred with Audible but issues were being resolved. She stated that WSO produced a new Audio Book named <u>Opening Our Hearts, Transforming Our Losses</u>, added no other audio books are being produced at this time.

Joyce Y., Archivist, stated a book is being prepared about Al-Anon's70th Birthday Celebration in October 2021. She provided copies of forms on Group History and Long timers Information; groups are encouraged to complete and return them. Joyce stated that Lynn Brown had sent an email about a missing book "Diary of a Motorcycle Hobo". Members were asked to look at their paperwork from the Fall Assembly to see if someone had accidentally picked it up.

Sheri D., Public Outreach Coordinator, reported on three opportunities this Quarter. First was Brazoria County's Walk to Recovery. Second was that Al-Anon literature was sold at the Mouth of the Brazos conference. And she reported that Joyce had coordinated a literature table at the 1st Annual Friendswood Health Fair. Sheri reported that Public Outreach is low on literature, and she will forward a report to Laura about P.O. for the next newsletter. Sheri asked about providing Al-Anon literature at Churches in District 4. Members suggested P.O. should be careful when involving Churches and only include Meeting Times in Church bulletins (to avoid being associated with outside interests.)

Alateen Coordinator, Renee G. reported that Carol, Area Alateen Coordinator, is planning Alateen sponsor training that is usually done after the POSSE weekend in March. She added that Posse is open to all Alateen Sponsors or anyone interested in this service work, and credit for training for new Alateen Coordinator training or recertifications for all current Coordinators can be obtained at this event.

Members had left the Zoom meeting and no one was present to report on Spanish Speaking Coordinator or Spanish translation.

Newsletter editor, Laura B reported that February 25th is the deadline for the next edition of <u>The Light</u> newsletter.

Margaret asked if members were experiencing problems navigating on the Texas Al-Anon website, and any problems should be reported to her. It was discussed that the software currently used on this website is difficult and outdated; research is being done to find and implement a better software. Margaret suggested that the Website Coordinator could be invited to attend a future meeting of District 4 to report on this topic and she will address this at the January meeting of Area World Service Committee (AWSC).

Old Business

Financial Audit Committee will meet in January 2022. Sheri asked how many members used the new Al-Anon mobile app as it could be a useful tool.

Delia discussed plans for A Day in Al-Anon fundraiser scheduled for Saturday, March 26, 2022, at the Alvin Taylor Street Club. This fundraiser starts at 9AM and will end at 3PM. She stated that the theme "Solutions ... In All Our Affairs" was chosen from a planning guideline for a fundraiser cancelled due to the pandemic. Delia noted that Al-Anon's book <u>In All Our Affairs</u> will be used as topics in three sessions with three panelists each. A flyer will be distributed ASAP, after official ATSC Board's approval (expected soon) is received on holding this fundraiser at the club in Alvin. Delia reported Registration Fee is \$10 prior to March 15th and \$15 onsite, and \$5 for Alateen. AFG groups in Alvin will donate paper goods, and Hospitality Chair Kimmey is planning a Taco Bar luncheon. The planning committee will ask the Intergroup Office to bring AFG literature and handle sales at this fundraiser. Paulette volunteered to chair the Silent Auction; Renee will chair the Bake Sale, and volunteers are needed to help with the Skit and donate baked goods.

New Business

Saturday, January 15th was selected as date to hold the next planning meeting for November 2022's ETAAC Fall Assembly. This meeting will be held at Margaret F.'s house at 6105 County Road 203, Liverpool, from 10AM to 1 PM. Margaret reported that the cost to rent the facility for this Assembly is \$3,000, and she suggested a registration fee of \$30.

This meeting on January 15th will also include a final planning meeting for A Day in Al-Anon.

Margaret reviewed dates for the next District 4 meeting and Saturday, March 12th was chosen; more details will be announced. She also encouraged members to register at (*ataactx.com*) and attend Texas Al-Anon's Annual ATAAC convention on February 18-20, 2022, at DFW Marriott in north Fort Worth. Joyce also reminded members to start saving for the next Al-Anon International Convention in July 2023 that will be in Albuquerque NM.

The meeting was adjourned, and members recited the Al-Anon Declaration.
